

Central Hall policy on responding to requests for marriage and blessings from same sex couples

The Methodist Church at Coventry Central Hall believes that all people are made in the image of God and that we are commanded to love God with all our heart, soul, mind and strength and our neighbours as ourselves. In this light, we seek to respond to couples seeking the ministry of the church as equally as possible, within the constraints of the law of the land and the discipline of the Methodist Church.

Following our Church Council passing a resolution to permit marriage of any couples we believe to be in a loving relationship, including same sex couples, we are now legally able to solemnise same sex marriages or to register civil partnerships at Central Hall. We have completed legal processes to register our building as required.

Accordingly, we are pleased to welcome all couples who wish the church's involvement in the celebration of their relationship. Our normal expectation would be that the couple would meet with the minister to discuss the occasion, to explore Christian understandings of God's love expressed in marriage and relationships and to undertake appropriate preparation and study. In this, we seek to respond to the particular needs and situation of each couple.

Couples who would be interested in exploring the possibilities around marriage or blessings etc. should contact the minister who can make the necessary arrangements.
